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Remote learning protocols

Please find below some information to help with home learning.

Top Tips

- Find a quiet place to work
- Read the timetable for the day so you are clear on what tasks need to be completed and when
- Ensure you know when the 'live' sessions are and attend all of these wherever possible
- If you are finding anything difficult, contact the adult running your seesaw immediately for help.
- Communicate where you are up to in each lesson even if you haven't managed to complete the whole task – send in what you have done for each session before the end of the day, or update via a message, alternatively, ask your teacher for more time to complete it

Live lessons

- These are just like lessons in school and the same behaviour expectations apply
- Please keep your microphone turned off when you attend the session
- If you wish to speak in the session please put your hand up and wait for an adult to say when you can turn the microphone on.
- Please do not switch on your microphone unless you have been asked to
- Please be sat at a desk or table as you would in a lesson and do not move around the house
- Please do not eat, drink or hold conversations with anyone else in the room at home during the live sessions
- Please leave your cameras on during the session for safeguarding reasons
- Please ensure you are appropriately dressed

We ask parents to support us by doing the following:

- Helping your child to follow the class timetable for the day
- Ensuring your child attends any live sessions wherever possible; live welcomes are still optional
- Checking your child's seesaw work at the end of each day, even if they are capable of completing this
 independently it is still helpful to have someone to check in that all the work has been completed this
 also enables you to be involved in your child's learning
- Check all tasks have been completed and returned according to the timetable and when requested by the teacher (including when your child has been asked to go back and correct/improve a task)
- Check that any comments or edits added by the teacher have been actioned / responded to by your child
