Our Golden thread...

Being creative has been our golden thread for this half term and this has been enhanced by some wonderful activities. Mrs Harris, our music teacher, organised a visit in school from the North Yorkshire Music Service. They presented a fantastic assembly during which the children listened to the musicians play a variety of instruments, whilst learning about how they worked. The children were thrilled by this session and were so inspired hearing 'The Snowman' and 'Harry Potter' themes being played.

Our classes have been exploring our thread even further...

Acorn Class took part in 'World Nursery Rhyme Week' – learning five different rhymes and actions during the week, as well as exploring the rhymes in various creative ways. Acorn have also been painting, drawing, and representing what they can see looking carefully at different objects. There has been some shine like a star moments when using a 'mixed media' approach!

Oak Class have been getting creative whilst learning about Hong Kong - making delicious spring rolls and learning about a new vegetable...pak choi! Pupils chose which vegetables they wanted alongside noodles and soy sauce. Oak have also been spending time in the wildlife area, experiencing a campfire just like the character Plop does in the story that has inspired their writing this half term – 'The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark'. They played games, sang campfire songs, sipped hot chocolate

and roasted marshmallows - it was truly magical and inspired lots of creativity to support our writing.




Oak and Palm also teamed up to get creative this half term, by attending the Big Book Hullabaloo event, hosted by The Little Ripon Book Shop. We met Alex T. Smith live on Zoom and found out all about his amazing books, how he found his inspiration for Mr Penguin, Claude and becoming an author - we have even more budding authors amongst us now! Alex shared his top tips for writing, as well as giving us a masterclass on how to draw Mr Penguin! We also met Bongo, his dog! A fabulous morning, which inspired pupils to write and illustrate their own Mr Penguin stories.



Palm & Cedar also got creative with a different kind of author – the comic book writer and illustrator Kev Sutherland. Kev creates comics for The Beano and Marvel, as well as creating his very own Shakespeare graphic novels Both classes enjoyed their very own comic art masterclass, during which Kev showed us how to create comic characters, storylines and then how to make our very own comic! We learned lots of helpful hints and tips, as well as having lots of fun and giggles. It was amazing to meet a real-life author and illustrator in person and to have our very own caricatures drawn by Kev.





Last week in school Palm got creative in their history learning – I thought I had stepped back in time when I saw the playground filled with lots of tiny Anglo-Saxons! Palm had a great day of learning with John, an Anglo-Saxon expert, who took us back in time to AD 200 when the first settlers arrived. Palm then moved through history, learning about the Roman army leaving England, invasion in AD 440s and onwards to 1066. John then shared some amazing artefacts that Palm went on to investigate. In the afternoon pupils embossed their initials in runes on pieces of leather to make a keyring. A great day was had by all!



Cedar Class have been getting creative in their geography learning, exploring The Grand Canyon in Geography and creating their own in the outdoor raised beds. It was a wonderful practical activity that demonstrated how erosion carves out our different landscapes. The children have been fascinated by how amazing our natural world is and how varied the biomes are within the United States of America.

The Grand Canyon has also been the focus of Cedar's artwork this half term. They have been sketching various landscapes and conveying texture through different media.



I think you will agree our golden thread has weaved its way into all our pupils' learning this half term!

Our golden thread for next half term is 'Life-long Readers' so we will be talking about books even more so than usual in school- is that possible? Of course! We absolutely

love reading at Kirkby Malzeard Primary School!
